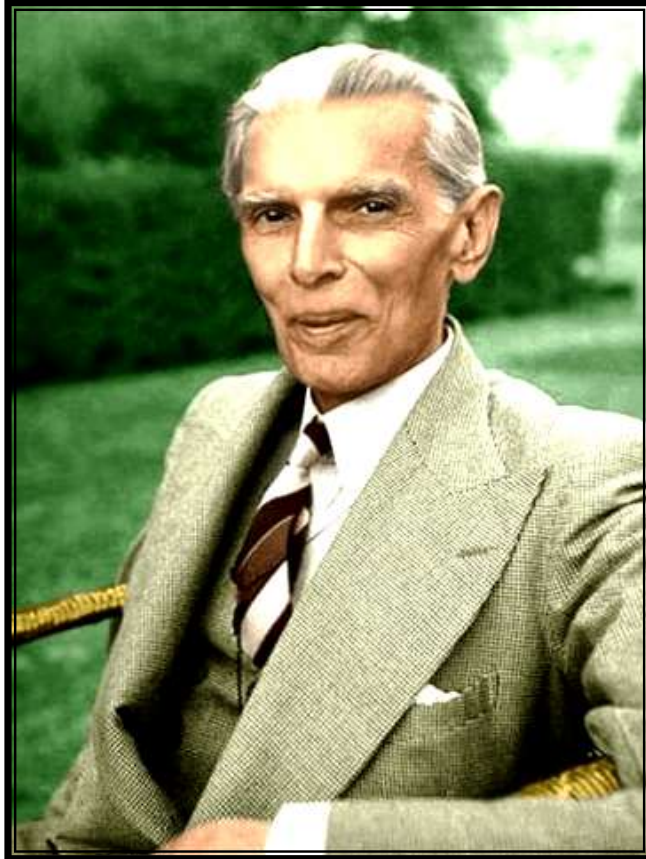

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1. Introduction/History

To achieve the lofty objectives of national integration, unity and solidarity of the Country, the provision of equal opportunities of quality education to all the citizens of the Country plays a pivotal role. Only a purposeful education and target-oriented training can enable the youth to enter the practical life as useful members of the society and to shoulder the responsibilities of nation-building.

It was in recognition of this that the scheme of Cadet College Larkana was initiated in 1975, under the directives of the then Prime Minister of Pakistan. Due to political upheavals, the scheme remained in oblivion for over a decade.

The project was reactivated in 1985 and its foundation stone was laid on 26 September 1988. The College was commissioned with bare minimum facilities and first student landed at Campus on 7 September 1992. At present, it is the biggest Cadet College from intake infrastructure and area point of view in the entire Country.

2. Location

The campus of Cadet College Larkana is situated on the Larkana-Mohen Jo Daro road about 3 kms from Mohen Jo Daro, the world-famous heritage of mankind. Larkana town is 24 kilometers away, while Mohen Jo Daro airport and railway station are 3 km and 5 km respectively away from the campus. The College is situated amidst beautiful natural surroundings. It combines the advantages of calm and serene atmosphere essential for effective dissemination and assimilation of instructions. The college has got estate of 262 acres.

3. Aim

To create an atmosphere of well-disciplined education and training, so as to prepare the youth for their active and result-oriented participation in all the fields of national life, particularly the Armed Forces of the Country with emphasis on quality education, leadership traits and character building.

4. Scope

The College Caters for formal education from Class VII to XII (Science only), pursuing the syllabi as prescribed by Sindh Text Book Board. Additional academic material at all levels is also extensively used for scholastic enrichment of the students. The College is affiliated with the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education Larkana.

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5. Governing Body

The College is governed by a Board of Governors constituted by Government of Sindh. The Board is headed by the General Officer Commanding 16 Division Pano Aqil Cantonment with adequate representation from the public.

6. Admission Policy

Admissions are made in class VII & VIII, strictly on merit, subject to general conditions as follows:-

- a. **Eligibility**: Sons of the persons domiciled in the areas mentioned here under are entitled to admission, as per the quota specified against each:-

- b. **Age & Qualifications**: Boys seeking admission must have passed class VI / VII, and **must not be** under 11 to 13 years for class VII and 12 to 14 years for class VIII on 30th June of the year of admission.

NOTE (1):- Relaxation of age on either side is NOT ALLOWED even for one single day. Moreover, the physical appearance of the candidate must also correspond to the age mentioned in his application form.

Note (2):- The College's Medical Board's decision about medical fitness shall be treated as final and shall not be challenged in any court of law.

7. Selection Procedure

a. **Availability of forms:** Admission forms can be obtained from designated branches as given in advertisement, or can be downloaded from our College's website www.ccl.edu.pk.

b. **Submission of forms:** Forms duly completed in all aspects be submitted along with documents / fees mentioned in the advertisement, by registered post courier/ by hand. After scrutiny, only eligible candidates shall be allotted roll numbers for subsequent written test / interview and medical tests.

c. Written tests

1. Written test shall be held as per given schedule in advertisement and intimated individually. The candidates shall attempt written papers of subjects of English, Mathematics and Sindhi (for Sindhi medium) and Urdu (for Urdu medium), as major subjects (with 50 marks each) with a part of Elementary Science, Islamiat, Social Studies (with 15 marks each) and General Knowledge (with 5 marks).

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2. The level of the test will be of the standard of Class VI & VII as prescribed by Sindh Text Book Board. Those, who qualify written test, shall be intimated individually and called for interview and medical examination, normally within fortnight of declaration of the result of the written test. Failure ones shall also be informed and their documents shall be returned.
3. Examination centers for the written tests and interviews shall be at Karachi, Sukkur, Shikarpur, Quetta, S.B.A (Nawabshah), Lahore and Larkana (could be changed by College Administration). Candidates shall indicate their choice of center in the application forms. Requests for change of center must be communicated timely and be based on genuine reasons.
4. List of successful /failure candidates in the written tests will normally be intimated to the candidates within four to six weeks from the date of examinations. The detailed results of the tests shall remain confidential and no queries / correspondence shall be entertained in this connection.
5. Those who qualify all stages of the Entrance Test are placed on a merit list finalized according to their performance. The final selection is based on the list and the relevant quota. The call-up letters for joining the College shall be issued and the selected candidates shall join the College on the given date.

Note:- The College will admit no liability for delay/non-delivery/loss etc., of the communication due to postal system's fault.

6. If the sufficient number of candidates does not reach the minimum standard for the purpose of admission from the quota of a particular Division, such seats will be allocated to other Divisions, where more deserving candidates are available.

8. Self-Financing Scheme

a. Certain percentage of the admissions in class VII & VIII is allocated for self-financing basis, in order of merit.

b. The students seeking admission on self-financing basis shall have to deposit a sum of Rs.2,50,000/= in the year of admission and Rs. 50,000 every year onward in addition to regular fees as described in Prospectus.

c. The other terms and conditions and pre-requisites shall remain same as in normal selection procedure.

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9. Scholarships

Scholarship Policy is as under:

- a. Scholarship @ 50% of full fees to top 2 position holders in Entrance Test and Interview of Class VII. Next Scholarship shall only be awarded once vacancy occurs.
- b. Scholarship @ 50% of full fees to top 3 position holders in Entrance Test and Interview of Class VIII. Next Scholarship shall only be awarded once vacancy occurs.
- c. Scholarship @ 50% of full fees to top 2 position holders in Annual Exams (including Terminal Test) of Class VII Cadets.
- d. Scholarship @ 50% of full fees to top 5 position holders in Annual Exams (including Terminal Test) of Class VIII Cadets.
- e. Scholarship @ 50% of full fees to top 5 position holders in Annual Exams (including Terminal Test) of Class IX Cadets.
- f. Scholarship @ 50% of full fees to top 5 position holders in Annual Exams (including Terminal Test) of Class X Cadets.
- g. Scholarship @ 50% of full fees to top 5 position holders in Annual Exams (including Terminal Test) of Class XI Cadets.
- h. Max 3x Scholarships for sons of Shuhadas (50% out of Full fee) of Armed Forces, Frontier Corps , Rangers and Police of Sindh domiciled only, Next Scholarship shall only be awarded once vacancy occurs.
- i. Max 3x Scholarships whose father dies during his studies at Cadet College Larkana , Next Scholarship shall only be awarded once vacancy occurs.
- j. Max 2 x Scholarships at 50 % of full fee, need based scholarship at discretion of Chairman BOGs and Principal one each. Next deserving shall be awarded once vacancy occurs.
- k. Cadets Brothers Concession: On Admission of Sibling of the existing Cadet, the boy studying already shall be given 50% concession in Tuition Fee only, until he passes out from the College.

10. Awards

In addition to the Scholarships, following awards are also given to the deserving cadets:

11. Fees and Charges

- a. Registration/Entrance Test Fee: Rs.3000/-
To be paid with application form)
- b. Admission Fee (Non-refundable): Rs.30,000/-
- c. Security Deposit (Refundable): Rs.25000/-
- d. Consolidated Fee 1. Class VII to X: Rs.310200/-
2. Class XI & XII: Rs.320400/-

The consolidated fees mentioned above includes tuition fee, lodging, boarding, laundry, games, medical treatment (OPD), library contribution, hair-cut, shoe repair, Language Lab, Computer Training etc. Parents are expected to appreciate that the College's only source of income is the fees paid by the parents. All efforts are made to hire best faculty, quality food for messing and the best services/ facilities and living conditions. Annual increase in fees hence, is a natural phenomenon and under compulsion, the fees are raised @ 5% to 15 % every year, according to the prevailing rate of inflation and general dearness in cost of goods and services provided.

e. Miscellaneous Charges: In addition to the above, the candidates shall have to pay actual charges for clothing, bedding and uniform.

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12. Procedure for Payment of Fees

a. All payments shall be made through Bank Draft / Pay Order in favour of Principal, Cadet College Larkana, "Payee's account only". No other mode of payment is acceptable. Cadet No., Name and House of the cadet must be clearly mentioned in the covering letter.

b. The fees, excluding those mentioned at para 8, are payable in two installments during the year. (**Full fee is charged for vacation period also**). The parents can also pay fees for whole year at a time.

NOTE:- FEE, EXCEPT SECURITY DEPOSIT, ONCE PAID, SHALL NOT BE REFUNDED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES. NO CASH PAYMENT IS PERMITTED EXCEPT CHEQUES/BANK DRAFTS.

13. Late Payment of Fees

If dues are not received within due date, the cadets shall be fined at the rate of Rs.10/ per day for the first month of the term and the defaulter cadet's name could be struck off the College rolls.

14. Non-Payment of Dues

If dues are not fully cleared, the defaulting cadet's forms for Board Examinations shall not be forwarded to the Board. Even if the form has been dispatched, the cadet concerned will not be allowed to appear in the Annual Examination, unless his fees account has been completely settled.

15. College Leaving Certificate

The boys seeking admission in this College are expected to stay in the institution till they appear at the final stage (HSC Part-II) exam. Therefore, the boys asking for School Leaving Certificate/ Migration before completion of their F.Sc., shall have to pay discontinuation fine of Rs. 25,000/- and full fees for the current session (Six Months) in which the boy applies for discontinuation, even if applied during vacations / term breaks e.t.c.

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16. Admission in Class XI

Admission/promotion to Class XI (HSC Part-I) of the boys already studying in Cadet College Larkana, shall be subject to:-

Securing at least 60% aggregate marks in the Matric exam.

17. College Year

The College year is divided into terms as under:-

a. **Academics:** College academic year is divided into following terms:-

- 1 Term-1: August to October
- 2 Term-2: November to January
- 3 Term-3: February to May

b. **Fees:** Fees are collected in advance on half yearly basis as under:-

- 1 July to December
- 2 January to June

18. Curriculum and Exams

a. The curriculum for all classes from class VII to XII, is based on the syllabi prescribed by the Sindh Text Book Board. The subjects taught in the College are Social Studies, Science, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology, Islamiat, English, Pakistan Studies, Urdu and Sindhi.

b. Internal examinations, i.e., monthly and terminal tests with annual exams in respect of all the classes, are held regularly to assess the progress of the cadets in the academics, and the parents are informed accordingly.



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19. Assessment / Evaluation

The process of academic evaluation and personality assessment is carried out round the year, through terminal tests/annual examinations and various activities and exercises are organized in the College. A comprehensive assessment book, recording five years assessment of each cadet, is maintained in every House/class.

20. Withdrawals

A cadet can be withdrawn from the College owing to his poor performance in studies as per details below:-

- a. **CLASS-VII & VIII**: If he is unable to get 45% marks in the terminal or Annual Examination.
- b. **CLASS-IX TO XI**: In case of preliminary examination of Class-IX and the Board exam of Class-XI, cadet's failure even in one subject may result in his withdrawal.
- c. The promotion to or continuance in Class-XI is not an automatic process. The Class-X boys, who wish to continue with this College, must have an excellent record in all fields at their credit.
- d. After the declaration of the result of the SSC Part-II (Class-X) examination, a cadet will not be allowed to continue in Class-XI, if he fails to secure at least 60% marks in each science subject.

21. Religious Training

For religious and ideological orientation of the cadets, various activities are carried out regularly i.e: teaching/ training of Hifz-e- Quranic Surahs with Tajweed-ul-Quran, Nazrah Quran, Hifz-e-Hadith, Na'at, Islamic Quiz (Quranic Quiz, Seerat Quiz,Fiqh Quiz). in addition to five-time prayers.



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22. Laboratories

For effective teaching of science, the practicals are carried out in well equipped and furnished Physics, Chemistry and Biology laboratories.



23. Computer Literacy

Keeping in view the importance of computers in our daily life, the cadets are given practice of laying hands on the keyboards of computers right from the first day of their entry in the College. There are three air-conditioned and fully furnished IT/ Computer Laboratories where cadets can operate computers under the guidance and supervision of qualified Instructors. Controlled access to Internet is provided to the students at Computer Labs under supervision.

24. Language Lab

To make up the deficiency in accent and pronunciations of the boys coming from the remote areas, two most modern and fully computerized Language Labs have been established in the College.



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25. Library

The College has a very rich library to cater for intellectual advancement of the teachers and the taught. It is, by and large, the best library among all the Cadet Colleges of the Country having over 40,000 titles in its shelves, besides Periodicals and Magazines. The books cover almost all the subjects in natural sciences and humanities. In addition to universally acclaimed reference works two compulsory Library periods per week are allotted to each class.



26. Physical Training

Physical training is an important feature of the College Routine. Training is imparted by qualified instructors. The College has got playing facilities for all major games like Hockey, Cricket, Football, Basketball and Athletics. It is mandatory for every cadet to participate in these games. (Additionally, the College has the facilities for Volleyball, Squash, Tennis, Badminton, Table-Tennis and other indoor games).



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27. Co-curricular Activities

A Swimming Pool of international standard is available in the College where each boy is provided opportunity of swimming and given training if needed.

a. Inter-house Husn-e-Qira'at, Naat, Debates, Hifz-e-Hadith, Hifz-e-Iqbal, Hifz-e-Latif, Hifz-e-Quranic Surahs, various quiz i-e Islamic quiz, Seerat quiz, Pak quiz, general knowledge quiz and poster making/ calligraphy and numerous other competitions are organized throughout the year.

b. Each house organizes regular weekly functions, literary sittings and brainstorming sessions along with different activities, with the aim to achieve over-all grooming of the boys.



28. Hobbies and Clubs

A number of hobbies and clubs are being promoted at the College to channelize the talents of the cadets in useful pursuits. These include photography, science, computer, painting, drama, philately, numismatics, debating and environmental clubs.



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29. Sailing Club

Cadet College Larkana is the first institution of the Country to have its own Sailing Club within the premises of its Campus. This water sports is organized under supervision of trained instructors from Pakistan Navy.

30. Riding Club

Cadet College Larkana has a Riding Club where cadets are taught horse riding.



31. Tours and Excursions

Tours, trips and excursions constitute important part of education. The College, therefore, arranges for all the classes, regular study tours, trips, picnics, visits to historical places and other institutions of the Country.



32. Career Counseling/ Motivational Lectures

The most important features of College activities are the career counselling, motivational lectures and interaction with scholars to let the cadets know about the teachers, scholars, experts and professionals, promote their scholastic skills and increase their general knowledge.

33. Daily Routine

All the activities in the College are carried out according to designed daily routine, which covers the activities of cadets from the time they rise early in the morning till they go to bed at night.

34. College Year Planner

A Calendar-cum-Year Planner, showing all the details of vacations/holidays, in addition to schedule of curricular and co-curricular events, organized throughout the year, is published and issued to all the cadets and their parents/guardians at the beginning of each session. All efforts are made to observe holidays/vacations indicated in the College Calendar.

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35. Parents Day

The College celebrates a mega event namely Parents Day every year. The prizes and awards won by the individual cadets and the Houses at various events, organized round the year, are awarded at this event. On this eve, a House is declared as the Champion House of the year.



36. Houses

a. There are twelve boarding houses (Hostels) on the campus. Houses are named after the great personalities of national and international importance, i.e., Jinnah



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House, Iqbal House, Effandi House, Latif House, Tipu House, Muhammad Bin Qasim House, Shah Baharo House, Allama I.I. Kazi House, Z.A. Bhutto House, Haider House, Hamza and Shahbaz House. The dormitories are spacious, airy and well furnished, and each cadet is provided with a cupboard, a study chair, a table and bookshelf. Apart from dormitories, there are cubicles for the appointment holders, selected from amongst the senior cadets who excel in qualities of leaderships.

b. Each House has a Recreation Room where the cadets get together in their free time and for indoor competitions. Daily newspapers, magazines and periodicals are regularly provided to cadets from the Library. A wholesome atmosphere of co-ordination, togetherness and mutual respect and understanding is ensured among the cadets. Every House is provided with a T.V set for recreation of the cadets.

c. Every House has a Housemaster, Assistant Housemaster, a House Tutor and a House-bearer to look after the cadets. The cadets are, however, expected to take care of their own kit, etc., and to make their beds. Geysers have been provided in each House, and air coolers in every room/dormitory.

37. Cadets Mess



The Mess functions under the supervision of a senior member of the teaching staff. Cadets are also associated with the management of the Mess. The Mess Committee meets regularly to review the menu and discuss ways and means of improving the messing standard. The Mess Committee is presided over by the Principal and it includes the senior teachers and appointment holders from the cadets. Meals are wholesome and balanced. However, there is no provision for extra messing.

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38. College Dispensary

The College has a dispensary having Medical Inspection Room and detention room for patients. It is manned by a qualified full-time Medical Officer assisted by dispensers. Records pertaining to the health of the cadets are maintained regularly. The College has its own ambulance to evacuate the cadets in case of emergency to the hospital of the city (Larkana). College Dispensary has also its own fumigation machine for antimalarial / Dangué spray at different times.



39. Cafeteria

There is spacious and well furnished Cafeteria along with a Tuck-shop, where the cadets are provided with facilities of refreshments, including articles of daily use. The place is also used as meeting-venue for parents who come to see their wards on weekends



40. Regular Publications

The College magazine “INDUS” is published annually in three languages (English, Urdu and Sindhi), which contains articles and essays written by the cadets and the teachers. Every cadet is issued with a copy of this annual magazine. A news bulletin named ‘Larkanians’ Letter’, covering all the activities of the College, is also published monthly and issued to all the cadets and parents, in addition to quarterly ‘Creativity’ carrying original write-ups of the students only, provide a platform to potential prolific writers.

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41. Teacher-Parent Meetings

To keep the parents informed of their sons' academic progress and to discuss the cadets' achievements/deficiencies, teacher-parent meetings are convened regularly. This forum is also utilized to have suggestions of the parents for the over-all betterment of the institution.

42. Parents' visit to College

a. The cadets joining this institution would naturally take some time to adjust themselves in a new atmosphere. The parents are advised to pay visits to the new boys which will help them to adjust in the College. It will, therefore, be in the interest of boys as well as of the College that the parents restrict their visits to the College to the minimum unless it is unavoidable.

b. Parents/guardians can visit their sons/wards on Sundays, and national holidays, from 9.00 am. to 5.00 pm.

43. Breaks and Holidays

There will be a fixed number of holidays and term-breaks as indicated in the College Calendar that cadets may avail them accordingly.

44. Penalties

a. The following punishments will be awarded to a cadet, if he comes late, or absents himself on the expiry of leave or vacation:

1. Late arrival by over one hour : a fine of Rs.500/-
2. Absence for one day : a fine of Rs.1000/-
3. Absence for subsequent days : a fine of Rs.500/-
per day upto a maximum of six days.

(Extra drill, etc., may also be awarded in addition to the fine)

b. The name of cadet shall be struck off the College rolls after six days' un-authorized absence, without any further notice.

45. Dress

Cadets wear following dress on different occasions:-

- a. **Academics:** Khaki uniform of army pattern is worn during classes, parade and drill.
- b. **Walking Out:** The same is to be used during preps, dinner, while going outside the College campus and on Saturdays.

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- c. **Games & P.T:** College Shorts, vests and prescribed P.T. shoes are to be used during games and P.T.
- d. **Prayer Dress:** White Qameez / Shirt/ Kurta/ Shalwar/ Pajama and cap with black shoe or Peshawari Chappal can be used for all prayers, including Juma prayers. During winter, jersey pull-over or sweater is used.

47. Prohibited Items

Cadets are NOT permitted to keep the following:-

- a Animals (pets etc)., Transistors, Video Games, and electric appliances.

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- b Wireless Radio, TV set, Walkman,ipad, Personal Computer, Laptop. Cellular / Mobile Phone, Video Camera etc.
- c Dagger, Sword or Weapon of any type.
- d Cigarettes, narcotics in any form, Matches, burners, heaters.
- e Explosive, combustible material etc.
- f Unauthorized medicine / drugs.
- g Unauthorized pattern of clothes, shoes etc

48. Rules and Regulations

Upon admission to College, each cadet and his father/guardian will automatically bind himself to abide by the College rules/regulations and orders (written or verbal) in vogue, or issued from time to time. Penalties for infringement shall be at the sole discretion of the Principal. These rules/regulations shall not be questioned under any circumstances. Requests for admission are accepted on the implicit understanding that these conditions are acceptable to the applicant and his father/guardian.

49. Telephone Calls

Parents may contact their sons/ wards through landline telephone as per following schedule:

- 1. Saturdays : 1430 hours to 2200 hours
- 2. Sundays/ Holidays : 0900 hours to 1900 hours

a. If any emergency arises the parents are advised to contact the concern House Master, Assistant Housemaster, Vice Principal or Principal.

b. Change of postal address or telephone number, must be intimated to the College immediately on occurrence.

50. Expulsion

A cadet may be expelled from the college on any of the following grounds:-

- a. Cheating, lying, stealing, gambling and immoral conduct.
- b. Willfully and deliberately damaging the College property.
- c. Keeping fire-arms or knives of large size, etc.
- d. Breaking bounds.
- e. Rudeness to staff and senior cadets or rude behaviour of cadet's parents.
- f. Absenting from the class and any other college activities without proper cause.
- g. Being habitually unpunctual, untidy and slovenly.
- h. Smoking, use of narcotics in any form.

PROSPECTUS

- i. Consistently giving poor performance in academics.
- j. Use of unfair means in tests/examination, even assisting others in it.
- k. Guilty of any act of indiscipline/misconduct.
- l. Lack of Interest in Studies/Discipline.

THE DECISION TAKEN BY THE PRINCIPAL IN DISCIPLINARY CASES SHALL BE FINAL AND SHALL NOT BE CHALLENGED IN ANY COURT OF LAW.

51. Journey to College/Home

It will be the responsibility of the parents/guardians to arrange safe journey for their sons/wards going home and back to the College, on beginning of breaks/holidays and after holidays. However, where possible, the College may arrange journey of the cadets by rail/road or air in groups on behalf of the parents/guardians, for which the parents shall have to pay in advance the fare through demand draft, for the entire journey.

52. Accident/Mishaps

The college will adopt all possible measures for the safety of the cadets during their stay at the College campus. However, the College shall not be responsible for any kind of accident/mishaps, causing any physical harm or injury.
